Thank you to everyone who has supported the 2017 Shoebox Challenge. 42 shoeboxes have been made and collected by the team distributing them around Eastern Europe.

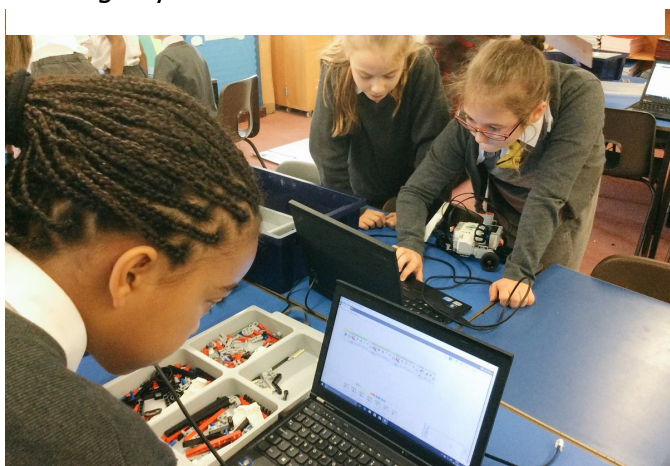
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### STEM day for pupils in Year 5
